Kumu Hula Kawika Keikiali'ihiwahiwa Alfiche has been teaching hula and other aspects of Hawaiian culture for over 17 years and has been a student of the Hawaiian culture all of his life. Kawika is the Kumu Hula for Halau o Keikiali'i and is the Director for the Kaululehua Hawaiian Cultural Center in So. San Francisco. With a mission to preserve and perpetuate all things Hawaiian, Kawika spends his life learning, teaching and sharing his culture through the hula and other cultural art forms. His first Kumu Hula was Tiare Maka-Olanolan Clifford of Hanalei, Kaua'i. After her passing in 1992, Kumu Kawika became haumana of Kumu Hula Harriet Kahalepoli Keahilihau-Spalding of Keaukaha, Hawai'i who opened halau with Kumu Kawika in 1994. Aunty Harriet's Kumu was her grandmother, Mary Ahi'eha Kekuewa, who was affectionately known as Mama Fuji'i. In 1996, Aunty Harriet encouraged Kawika to learn from Kumu Hula Rae Kahikilaulani Fonseca of Hilo, Hawai'i - an uniki of Uncle George Lanakilakekiahiali'i Na'ope, a hula master and treasure of Hawai'i. In March 2007, Kumu Kawika was one of six to be a part of Kumu Rae's first and only uniki. been teaching oli (chant) and providing protocol for special events such as the homecoming of Hōkūle'a (re-created historic voyages by double-hulled canoe), the opening of the Prince Lot Hula Festival as well as the first known public performance of the Kumulipo (Hawaiian creation story) in its entirety in both the 20th and 21st centuries.

Lei are essential to not only to a hula person but also to the Hawaiian Culture past and present and lei making is a necessity. It is an art that takes a life-time to master and learning is always constant. When our elders are asked how long it takes to be an expert lei maker, the common response is, "I am still learning". There are many type of lei styles. In this workshop we'll focus on the Lei Wili (Windng technique) commonly referred to as a "Haku". Come learn lei making techniques with Halau o Keikiali'i.
